Performing Group Contract

Please read this letter concerning the Performing Group. Listed here is ALL the information you will need to know and understand to have a great season including dates, times, costs, requirements and procedures. If you are interested in the Performing Group, but anything you read here is confusing or impossible for you, please call the studio. Note: All students should have received an email with Class and Performing Group Level recommendations already. If there was no Performing Group recommendation on your email (this was an error), or if you did not receive an email at all, please call us.

Please call or email the studio with your intent to participate by 8/31/15. You can bring the forms listed at the end of this document to the studio on your first day of class.

Important Upcoming Event - Saturday, September 12th

Every year, we try to have a group photo taken of the entire performing group to hang in the studio. This photo will also be available for purchase. We will take photos inside the studio, and also outside if the weather allows it. Please be on time!!!

No Rehearsals for any groups on this day.

What to wear: All dancers should wear plain black fitted shorts, a plain black spaghetti strap leotard, hair pulled back in a low pony with left side part, no tights, and tan jazz shoes. If you do not have the items listed above or do not know how to do a low pony with a left side part, contact the studio.

Performing Group Philosophy, Level Placement and Rate of Progress

Performing Group is for dancers who want to enhance their dance training through performances, competitions and conventions. Dancers will be placed in groups according to certain criteria that the studio feels will allow the students to dance to the best of their ability. Students learn at different rates from each other, they progresses differently, and they often take different classes. Since the studio cannot predict how much an individual student will improve in relation to their classmates, we will have our staff evaluate each student throughout the year in classes, at competitions, and at our May/June Auditions to discern where students should be placed the following year.

Performing Group Events

Each Group (with the exception of Silver and Gold) will perform in three competitions, participate in one convention, and dance in the May Recital. There are many other optional competitions and conventions dancers may attend. Note: Silver and Gold dancers are not required to participate in a Convention, and we will discuss with these groups how many competitions they will attend.

Every competition and performance can be different with different performance areas, sizes, requirements, and schedules. The organizers of the events we attend sometimes do not supply us with this information until the week before the event. Therefore . . .

It is highly recommended that Performing Group Students attend all classes the week before any mandatory performance or competition. Please get homework done and do not schedule any trips the week before any mandatory event. If you are not feeling well, come and watch your class. If you very ill and cannot attend class, call the studio.

Options and Class Requirements (same as last year)

Students have the option of participating in the performing group with various time commitments. Look at the options below and let the studio know what you wish. Note: Gold and Silver Dancers only need to concern themselves with Option #1.

- Option #1 Weekday Only:
 - Dancers learn one jazz routine during their weekday PG class. In addition to their weekday PG class, dances are required to take one Ballet, one Jazz, and one other class of their choice (lyrical, contemporary modern, tap, hip hop, acro) per week
- Option #2 Weekday AND Saturdays:
 - Dancers learn one jazz routine during their weekday PG class AND one lyrical and one contemporary routine during their rehearsals on Saturdays. In addition to their weekday PG class, dances are required to take one Ballet, one Jazz, one Lyrical, one Contemporary Modern and their Saturday Company Class.
- Option #2A Weekday AND Lyrical only Saturdays:
 Dancers learn one jazz routine during their weekday PG class AND one lyrical routine during their rehearsal on Saturdays. In addition to their weekday PG class, dances are required to take one Ballet, one Jazz, one Lyrical, and their Saturday Company Class.
- Option #2B Weekday AND Contemporary only Saturdays:
 Dancers learn one jazz routine during their weekday PG class AND one contemporary routine during their rehearsal on Saturdays. In addition to their weekday PG class, dances are required to take one Ballet, one Jazz, one Contemporary Modern, and their Saturday Company Class.
- Option #3 Weekday, Saturdays and Sundays:
 - Dancers learn one jazz routine during their weekday PG class AND one lyrical and one contemporary routine during their rehearsals on Saturdays AND one special routine on Sundays. In addition to their weekday PG class, dances are required to take one Ballet, one Jazz, one Lyrical, one Contemporary Modern, their Saturday Company Class, the Saturday Lyrical and Contemporary Modern Rehearsals, and attend Sundays 11am-3pm for classes and rehearsals.

Attendance/Lateness Policy (same a last year)

- September through December dancers may miss, arrive late, or leave early a TOTAL MAX of 4 regular classes and 3 weekday PG classes and Saturday Rehearsals.
- January through February dancers may miss, arrive late, or leave early a TOTAL MAX of 3
 regular classes and 2 weekday PG classes and Saturday Rehearsals.
- March through May dancers may miss, arrive late, or leave early a TOTAL MAX of 3 regular classes and 3 weekday PG classes and Saturday Rehearsals
- If you miss more than the max without extreme emergencies or injuries you will be removed from your PG routines.
- If you suffer an injury, you will be required to attend all classes to walk thru routines or watch. You must be up and dancing full out at least 2 weeks BEFORE a performance or competition.
- If you have a college visit conflict, you must notify us in advance to see what is workable. If you have a medical emergency, you must also discuss this with us to see what is workable.
- Dancers are required to learn material that was missed due to an absence, by the next class.

Injuries and Illnesses

Students unfortunately get injured. Although we try to keep students involved, students may have to be removed from choreography if they are unable to rehearse. Equally so, all students must notify the studio of any injuries they have sustained – their health is more important than dance, and dancing through injuries is not always wise.

Volunteering

All parents of Performing Group students must either offer to volunteer at our May Recitals or pay a small fee. Families will have a choice, they can either offer to help at two of our five May Recital shows, help at one show and pay a \$50 Performing Group Volunteer fee, or help at none of the shows and pay a \$100 Performing Group Volunteer fee. We will, as we have done in the past, also credit families \$20 per show for each event they assist. Families may volunteer for more than two rehearsals/shows. Once we have finalized the show and rehearsal dates, we will post a volunteer sign up list at the studio. More information will come in October.

Dress Code

All dancers must follow the dress code (see the attached Dress Code document). For all Ballet and Pointe Classes – dancers must wear a leotard, tights, ballet slippers and hair in a proper bun. They have the option of wearing a ballet skirt as well. For all Jazz, Lyrical, Modern, Contemporary Modern and Tap classes – dancers must wear form fitted dance attire (such as a fitted top or leotard and fitted shorts, capris or leggings) and must have their hair completely pulled back in either a ponytail or bun. No Crop tops or sports bras are allowed in classes. No bagging clothing.

Costumes

The Paul Klocke Studio of Dance will provide most costumes for Performing Group routines. We may reuse costumes that we have in our inventory; we may reuse costumes from previous recitals, and students may be required to donate their costumes from previous recitals or events for other students to wear. Students may wear the same costume, multiple times, over the span of several years. Students may also need to purchase small costume accessories or pieces such as earrings, dance shorts, tops, pants, etc.

Communication

We will send an email every Monday to communicate things weekly. You MUST read these every week! We also supply a calendar which lists all events, due dates, etc. Everyone will receive a contact sheet of ALL dancers in the entire PG.

Conduct and Social Media

All dancers need to be wise and smart in the way they act, talk and write on social media and texts. Everyone needs to be kind. If someone is not being a team player, not following the rules of the studio and/or not conducting their behavior in a kind way they will be removed from the PG. Posting inappropriately on social media will not be tolerated and will result in removal form the PG.

PG Sisters

Each dancer will be given a sister for the season as a fun way to connect with a special friend.

Payments

All events will have a required Registration Form with a due date and an amount due. All performing group payments must be made separately from studio payments. Fees will be higher if forms are turned in after the due date.

PG Sold Products

We will have certain optional apparel and products for the PG to purchase such as a team track jacket. All dancers except Gold and Silver will be required to wear rhinestone earrings that will be sold by the studio.

Dancewear Discounts

The Brandywine Dance Shoppe offers a 20% discount to all Performing Group Dancers for all their needed supplies.

Concerns and Problems

If you ever have any concerns or problems, come and talk to us privately. Do not make your concern public.

Special Numbers

All dancers are eligible to do a special number (solo, duo, trio) to be performed at most competitions (but not all Conventions and NOT at the Recitals). Please refer to the Special Number Contract for specific details and pricing.

Required: SoDanca JZ45 caramel color jazz shoes, or Bloch S0495L Tan Neo Flex jazz shoes. Leotard (any color). Tights. (Pink, black, or tan. *Bloch Light Tan required for the Spring Recital.)

Allowed: Form-fitting dance shorts, dance pants, fitted yoga pants, leggings. Form-fitting camisole top or tank top over the leotard.

Not Permitted in Child 1 through 3:

Encouraged: Footless/convertible tights. (Pink, black, or tan. *Bloch Light Tan required for the Spring Recital.)

Allowed: Form-fitting dance shorts

Not Permitted in Tumbling:

- Tutu's
- Bra/Crop Tops
- Bare midriffs
- Sheer, or see-through tops that do not cover the front
- Sheer, or see-through bottoms
- Large, flowy or loose shirts and/or tank tops or bottoms

Child 4 through 5:

Ballet/Tap

Hair: Long hair in bun, ponytail, or braid; short hair secured off the face.

Required: Pink Ballet Shoes. Black tap shoes. Leotard (any color). Tights. (Pink, black, or tan. *Ballet: Bloch Pink required for the Spring Recital; *Tap: Bloch Light Tan required for Recital.)

Allowed: Ballet skirt (separate or attached), form-fitting dance sweater. Tap students may wear form-fitting dance shorts, dance pants, fitted yoga pants, leggings, and/or a form-fitting camisole top or tank top over their leotard if they wish.

Jazz

Hair: Long hair in bun, ponytail, or braid; short hair secured off the face.

Required: SoDanca JZ45 caramel color jazz shoes, or Bloch S0495L Tan Neo Flex jazz shoes. Any color leotard. Tights (Pink, black, or tan. *Bloch Light Tan required for the Spring Recital.)

Allowed: Form-fitting dance shorts, dance pants, fitted yoga pants, leggings. Form-fitting camisole top or tank top over the leotard.

Not Permitted in Child 4 through 5:

- Tutu's
- Bra/Crop Tops
- Bare midriffs
- Sheer, or see-through tops that do not cover the front
- Sheer, or see-through bottoms

Anything Baggy

Ballet

Hair: Bun (Students in Intermediate A-C levels will be taught how to do a bun in class in September.) Required: Leotard (any color). Tights (pink, black, or tan). Pink leather or Bloch canvas ballet shoes.

Allowed: Ballet skirt (no longer than mid-thigh), cropped tight fitting dance sweater (no hood).

Tap

Hair: Long hair in bun, ponytail, or braid; short hair secured off the face.

Required: Tap Shoes (black oxfords). Note *Advanced B Tap students may need to obtain Tan Heels for Recital; please speak to the studio before buying new shoes.

Encouraged: Any color leotard. Tights (pink, black, or tan).

Allowed: Form-fitting dance shorts, dance pants, fitted yoga pants, leggings. Form-fitting camisole top or tank top.

Jazz and Lyrical

Hair: Long hair in bun, ponytail, or braid; short hair secured off the face.

Required: SoDanca JZ45 Carmel color jazz shoes, or Bloch S0495L Tan Neo Flex jazz shoes.

Encouraged: Any color leotard. Tights (pink, black, or tan).

Allowed: Form-fitting dance shorts, dance pants, fitted yoga pants, leggings. Form-fitting camisole top or tank top.

Contemporary Modern

Hair: Long hair in bun, ponytail, or braid; short hair secured off the face.

Required: Access to bare feet.

Encouraged: Any color leotard. Footless/convertible tights (pink, black, or tan), or fitted pants that reach below the knee.

Allowed: Form-fitting dance shorts, dance pants, fitted yoga pants, leggings. Form-fitting camisole top or tank top.

Acro

Hair: Long hair in bun, ponytail, or braid; short hair secured off the face.

Required: Access to bare feet

Encouraged: Any color leotard. Footless/convertible tights (pink, black, or tan).

Allowed: Form-fitting dance shorts, dance pants, fitted yoga pants, leggings. Form-fitting camisole top or tank top.

Hip Hop:

Hair: Any

Required: Sneakers or jazz shoes. (You will need ALL black shoes for the recital.)

Allowed: Dance shorts, dance pants, fitted yoga pants, leggings, sweatpants, gym shorts, harem pants. Fitted camisole top or tank top. Large, flowy, or loose shirts, tank tops, or bottoms that completely cover the torso.

Not Permitted in Hip Hop:

Bra/Crop Tops

Bare midriffs

 Sheer, or see-through tops that do not cover the front Sheer, or see-through bottoms

 Tops with large arm cut outs that reach below the bra-line

Performing Group/Company Classes/Weekend Rehearsals:

Jazz or Lyrical attire is required. The only exception - if ballet is being taught during the Saturday company class, then ballet attire is required. Students participating in the Saturday company classes will be given a schedule as to what type of dance is being taught each week.

Notes:

- Students at or below Child 5 level may obtain ballet and tap shoes from Payless Shoes. All other students should
 consider purchasing a higher quality of dance shoes from the Brandywine Dance Shoppe (302) 478-4403. The
 prices at either store are similar.
- Students who are just trying classes should call the studio before purchasing dance clothes. We will tell you what you may wear until you have decided on a class.
- If you have dance shoes of a different color or style that still fit, please talk to the studio before buying new shoes.
- If you have a question about attire you have purchased, do not remove the tags and bring the item with you (not on you)
 to the studio to be approved.

This year our main convention will be the JUMP Convention held in King of Prussia from January 29 - 31, 2016. See information below.

Competitions Attached to Conventions

- Several Conventions have attached Competitions. We typically do not perform Group Routines at Convention/Competitions unless an entire group is attending the same Convention.
- Many Convention/Competitions have a limit as to how many solos can be entered. Please do not assume that you will be able to compete your solo at these events. We typically pick solos to compete at these events based upon the student's group level and age.

Observer Fees

• Most Conventions have observer fees, that means parents must purchase a ticket (or possibly a wristband) to see the event. The observer fee only needs to be paid if the parent wishes to actually go into the classrooms and watch the classes. You do not have to pay an observer fee if you plan to stay in the building but do not plan on going into the classrooms. Note: If there is an optional competition attached to the convention, they usually allow the audience in without charge (or with minimal charge). On the events listed below, it should state if observer fees are required.

Dress Code Agreement

Important! Last year there was confusion about our dress code. We want to make sure that we have gotten the correct information to everyone. Please read this document, call us with any questions, sign the bottom, and return it to the studio main office.

First, review the Dress Code Chart for information as to what students should wear for each class.

Important Dressing Room Change

Paul Tocke

We were desperately short of studio space and have converted our dressing room into a small studio. Since most of our students were not using our dressing room as a dressing room – they were using it as a waiting and storage room and changing in the bathrooms if they had to – this change will be an inconvenience to a few, but for most of our students, it should have little effect.

What this means:

- Students should now arrive at the studio, whenever possible, already dressed in their dance clothes for classes.
- If they are coming right from school, students can still change quickly in either of our two bathrooms.
- If students have two different styles of dance on the same day, they either need to wear the same outfit for both classes or they need to plan their outfits out in advance in such a way that it only takes them 1 or 2 minutes to change from one outfit to another.

What students should do with their non-dance street clothing?

Parents may keep their children's clothing with them. We have also placed clothing hooks down our long hallway by the water fountain, and shoe mats under the benches. If you are leaving items at the studio:

- Coats/ Clothing Hang on a hook or put in your dance bag.
- Shoes Put under the benches on the shoe mats or put in your dance bag.
- Valuables Put in your Dance bag and bring your bag into the studio with you.
- Dance Bags Bring your dance bag into the studio with you. Do not leave your dance bag in the hallway or hang on the hooks.

What Dress is not allowed (See Hip Hop on the Dress Code Chart for acceptable exceptions):

- Bra/Crop Tops
- Bare midriffs
- Sheer, or see-through tops that do not cover the front
- Sheer, or see-through bottoms
- Large, flowy or loose shirts, tank tops or bottoms
- Baby doll tops
- Gym Shorts
- Tops with large arm cut outs that reach below the bra-line
- Street clothes
- Anything Baggy

Notifying Students and Parents

We understand that students sometimes do not have (or forgot to bring) the correct attire for class. We allow students to still take the class; however, if the inappropriate attire is worn several times, we will, depending on the age of the student, either notify the student by talking to them directly or notify the parent through email.

For proper instruction, dance clothing needs to be tight fitting. Please call if you have any questions.
